OVERVIEW

Human Trafficking is a form of modern slavery that occurs in every state, including Illinois. Since 2007 there have been over 800 reported cases in Illinois alone. Most of the victims are women and US citizens.

This workshop will provide both an overview of human trafficking and insight into the role of health care providers on combating this phenomenon. In addition to learning how to recognize indicators of human trafficking in their patients, providers will also learn how to best approach victims and provide a supported referral.
